

While Canada has devoted considerable sums annually to pisciculture, the United States have not been lagging in their efforts to replenish the lakes and rivers with more valuable kinds of fish. The fishery is now in full operation. From fifteen million whitefish will be dumped into the Detroit river next spring from the American side, while the Dominion establishments will contribute about twenty millions. Two million trout will also be placed in the river from the American side. Wisconsin will turn adrift four million lake trout and a million whitefish. At Madison half a million brook trout eggs have been taken, and from that hatchery 150,000 California trout will be set afloat on the inland lakes and rivers of Wisconsin. At the State hatchery in Iowa, 100,000 California trout have been placed in the rivers. The different States are devoting much attention to fish breeding, and with the assistance of the Canadian establishments the supply in the lakes is doubtless continuing to be abundant.
