SWEETBREADS AND GREEN PEAS.four or more heart sweetbreads, parboil until firm, cool and press in a cloth between two tin sheets, with a weight on top; when cold fasten with a darning needle fine strips of fat pork on the best side; put sliced carrot in a saucepan with lard trimmings and aromatics (a bunch of herbs); add the sweathread, the larded side uppermost; moisten with white broth to half their height; put a buttered paper over, boil briskly, and then cook in a moder-ately heated oven for about forty minutes, taking care to baste the larding frequently, and glaze of bright light brown colour strain and free the gravy of its fat and reduce to a demiglaze sauce; pour a garnishing of green peas in a dish, range the sweetbreads in a circle over this, with the best one on the centre; glaze with the reduced gravy and serve..



and then we complain that there is something the matter with our heart. It is a won-der that it does not "stop short never to go again" long before it does.




