 Chancel Guild presided over the decorations of
 the Church, and flowers, fruit and autumn leaves
 made beautiful the house of prayer. The offer-
 tory, which went towards paying our overdraft
 at the bank, amounted to \$176.08, somewhat
 more than last year.

Thursday, October 19th, was celebrated as
 the Thanksgiving Day of the whole Dominion.
