

The Petition of Développement Central Ville-de-L'Isle Inc.

The Petitioner which is seeking an Act to authorize the construction of a toll-bridge and causeway over the St. Lawrence River near the City of Pointe-aux-Trembles was represented by a registered Parliamentary Agent. He stated that the Petitioner had first been advised that it could proceed with the construction of the bridge upon depositing the plans with the Minister of Public Works and upon application to the Governor in Council under Section 7 of the Navigable Waters Protection Act. Upon further consideration, however, it appeared necessary that the petitioner proceed by way of a Private Bill.

This change in procedure resulted in the petition being filed after the time specified in Standing Order 93.

As the petitioner wishes to proceed with the necessary legislation during this session, the Parliamentary Agent requested that the Petition be received.

* * *

Having considered the above-mentioned petition and the explanations of the Parliamentary Agent, your Committee recommends that Standing Orders 93, and 94(3) (a) and (c) be suspended; and that the petition be received. Concurrence in this report will result in the waiving of all charges in respect of the late reception of this petition and of the private bill based thereon.

The Petition referred to above, together with the Report of the Clerk of Petitions related thereto, is returned herewith.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Loiselle, seconded by Mr. Boulanger, the said Report was concurred in.

Mr. Wahn, from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, presented the Twelfth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Your Committee has considered Bill S-36, An Act respecting The Canadian Union Conference Corporation of Seventh-day Adventists, and has agreed to report it with the following amendment:

Clause 2, subclause 2, page 2, line 3:

Add at the beginning of said subclause 2 the words "*Except as otherwise provided in section 16 of Chapter 85 of the Statutes of 1955,*".

Bill C-95, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act, was again considered in Committee of the Whole;

And the House continuing in Committee;

Objection being taken in Committee to the decision of the Chairman (Mr. Lamoureux) on a point of order, and an appeal being made to the House;

Mr. Deputy Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman of the Committee made the following Report:

"In Committee of the Whole, when Clause 16 of Bill C-95, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act, was being considered, the honourable Member for Compton-Frontenac (Mr. Latulippe) proposed in amendment the following,—That clause 16 of the bill be amended by adding thereto, as clause 16A, the following:

'16A. This section shall also apply to small industries already located in the said designated areas and to industries which will improve their premises or purchase new equipment.'
