A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk to return the Bill (88), intituled: "An Act respecting Department of Transport Stores,"

And to acquaint the Senate that they have agreed to the amendments made by the Senate to the said Bill, without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (89), intituled: "An Act respecting a certain Provisional Trade Agreement between Canada and Germany," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time, and-

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a second reading to-morrow.
