CHANGES MADE IN IMPORT RATES BY FRANCE, ITALY AND GERMANY

FRANCE

France has imposed restrictions on the use of foreign wheat allowing percentages to be used as follows:

December 15, 1929, to July 26, 1930	3 per cent
July 26, 1930, to April 15, 1931	10 per cent
April 15, 1931, to April 18, 1931	15 per cent
April 18, 1931, to April 28, 1931	20 per cent
April 28, 1931, to June 16, 1931	25 per cent
June 16, 1931, to July 1, 1931	30 per cent
From July 1, 1931	25 per cent

Wheat Import Restriction

An Italian ministerial decree of June 15, 1931, lays down that 95 per cent of Italian wheat must be used in the production of flour for use in Italy, thus reducing the proportion allowed to be imported to 5 per cent. Previously there was no import restriction on wheat entering Italy other than the customs duty.
