Strawberries still come in in fairly large quantities, but were wet, and sold at 6c to 8c per box; a few of better quality bringing 8 1/2c.

Raspberries were wet also, and the bulk sold at 12 1/2c to 15c per box, some choice fruit selling at 18c per box.

Cherries were slightly firmer in price, the sour variety selling at 80c to 90c per 11-quart basket, and 90c to 40c per 8-quart basket.

Cucumbers were plentiful and declined slightly, selling at 40c to 50c per 11-quart basket.
