

The Town of Selkirk

The most picturesque town in the Province of Manitoba is beautifully and advantageously situated on the Red River, midway between the City of Winnipeg and Lake Winnipeg. Nature has done much to make the town attractive; the broad winding river with its well wooded banks makes a most pleasing prospect when viewed from the high ground on which the town is built, or when taking a trip down the river on one of the lake passenger steamers, which are fitted up with all the modern conveniences. Trees have been planted by the citizens on the most principal streets. Evelyn Street in particular is admired by every visitor, and often characterized as being the most picturesque street in the Province.

Selkirk presents a "busy" appearance at all times of the year, in addition to being the centre

of a good agricultural district it has the advantage of being the head of navigation for the Red River, with its numerous resources.
