Hiller of Duluth, president of the company, went over to England and reported that arrangements had been made for the securing of capital for the erection of 100 stamps on the property, which is an extensive low grade proposition. Mr. W. D. Ramsey, an English mining engineer, on behalf of the English meonic engineer, on behalf of the English meonic engineer, on behalf of the English people who were to supply the stamps, came over, spent three months upon the Alice A. reef, made several mill tests, decided that the ore ran on an average of \$5 to the ton, and sent a favorable report to England.

After the receipt of this favorable report it was arranged that the English company, known as the British and Ontario Gold Mining Company, was to put up \$50,000 for the erection of the big projected stamp mill. Under this arrangement the American-Canadian stockholders in the Alice A. were to receive one share of British and Ontario stock for each five shares they held in the American-Canadian Company. This arrangement was ratified by the shareholders of the latter company in June last, and it was thought that everything would go smoothly. Since then, however, it seems that Col. Hiller, who has at the same time been endeavoring to put thru a water power and timber limit deal, has reported his inability to conclude the arrangements upon the old terms, and under date of London, Eng. Feb. 20, he writes that if the Canadian and American shareholders will accept one share in the English company for every 10 shares they hold in the American-Canadian company, he thinks he can wind up the deal, and he asks that a circular be issued to the shareholders putting this proposition to them.
