AT THE MERCY OF CANADA

Prohibition of Export of Pulwood Would Close Up Many Yankee Paper Mills.

THE MAINE FORESTS DESOLATED

Recent Decision of United States Increasing Duty a Foolish Act, Says Col. Bowie.

"If the Canadian government prohibited the export of pulpwood to the United States, it would have the effect of closing up many of the paper mills of that country." So said Col. H. B. Bowie of Baltimore, Maryland, who is in the city on a visit, a guest at the Arlington Hotel.

A Foolish Decision.

The decision of the United States government to raise the duty on pulpwood coming in from Canada, is, to Col. Bowie, a most foolish step. It will have the effect of stopping, to a considerable extent, the exportation of paper from the United States, and will cause an immense rise in the price of pulpwood there.

Dependent on Canada.

"So that you see," said Col. Bowie, "how dependent we are in the United States on Canada for our supply of suitable wood for paper-making."

Has a War Record.
