THEATRICAL AGENTS ALARMED

Ciaim Legislation Limiting Commissions Would Be Ruinous.

ALBANY, N.Y. June 3.—The so-called "white rats" bill, making the law governing theatrical employment agencies more stringent, and limiting their commissions to five per cent. was opposed to-day at a hearing before Governor Hughes by Henry W. Taft and Maurice Goodman. representing the United Booking Office; Charles F. Murphy, who appeared on behalf of the dramatic agents at New York, City, and W. E. Angelman, representing the Lyceum Bureaus.

Mr. Taft contended that the bill was unconstitutional, and was class legislation. Mr. Angelman said such a measure would compel the Lyceum Bureaus to give up their business, as a five per cent. commission would not pay expenses.

A delegation of "white rats" appeared in favor of the bill, headed by Assemblyman Green, its introducer, who explained its provisions.


