me as custodian for St. Philip's church

all of which was reported and went

to the purpose for which it was solicited.

I heartily thank those who contributed.

The church has been renovated and

repainted to the amount of \$800. All

business is done through an official board

organized when I took charge of the

church, also a systematized order of

service.

The congregation has not been dis-

ciplined up to the point where they will

support their church by giving systemat-

ically; thus our Sunday collections are

from \$1.50 to \$5, averaging about \$12

per month, which will not pay the ex-

penses for coal, light and advertise-

ments, especially in winter.

I am afraid unless the charitably dis-

posed of the city remember us as well as

the Belgians the church will not be able

to keep open, especially should the con-

ference send a minister with a large fam-

ily here. A few of the congregation give

liberally but the majority give but one

cent each. There may be 150 persons at

service, seventy-five of these will give

a cent each, the other half will average

about three cents each. This is ridiculous

in the light of modern civilization.

The strenuous times brought about

by the war and meagre donations this

year having received \$7 from the white

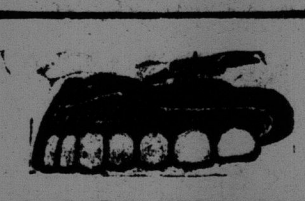
