THE TWO VIEWS. (New York Evening Post.)

"The man who deliberately cuts prices below the actual cost of the goods, in a business way, is a criminal and a menace to society," exclaims an excited financial writer. But wait a minute, brother, let us reason together. Do you mean by "actual cost" the original cost of the goods or the cost of replacement? There is a world of difference. If a dealer holds his goods for their original cost while his competitors are replacing their stocks from a lower market, he is surely committing suicide in a business way. No one but a maniac will sell his goods for less than their cost if he can help himself. Normally, the making of prices does not rest wholly with the dealer; it takes two to make a bargain. A few months ago, when there was a seller's market, and the buyers were compelled to pay the seller's price or go without, such a statement as that just quoted might have passed for wisdom. But we are now in a buyer's market, and it is the sellers who must take the line. Many of them will have to cut prices—deliberately cut them—below the actual cost of the goods, and they will be neither criminals nor a menace to society.
