Canada's Trade Minister Head of Permanent Trade Commission Ottawa, Jan. 27.-It is rumored that Sir George E. Foster, minister of trade and commerce, may remain in England. The assumption is that if he stays there it will be as head of a permanent trade commission to take charge of Canadian interests in the British Isles and on the continent.

IRON, STEEL, METAL AND MACHINERY

In its summary of the iron, steel, metal and machinery markets for week ended January 26, Canadian Machinery and Manufacturing News, Toronto, makes the following comment: Price-cutting on steel continues. It seems very likely that base prices named recently will be the bottom of the market for some months to come. It is claimed that the concessions already have been made without any reduction in labor charges, and that anything else that is done in the way of price reduction will only be possible if wages come to a lower level. It is claimed that 75 per cent. of the cost of producing steel is in the labor charges, and until this section is touched there can be no further reductions.

CROSS MEDITERRANEAN IN AN AIRPLANE


