



FIND LAST BIG GUN SITE. Emplacement for This "Big Bertha"
Was in Corbi Wood.

Washington, Sept. 18—French soldiers have located the emplacement of the last big cannon used by the Germans in the bombardment of Paris. An official dispatch from France says:—

"In the Corbi Wood, in the neighborhood of Beaumont and Cutgny, the platform of the last Bertha fixed up to fire on the Paris region has been found. The spot is just as airplane photographs have shown it to be. The gun itself had of course, been removed.

"The position is in two different parts, one for the real gun and one for a sham. Both are exactly alike. The emplacement consists of a pit divided in three parts, twelve meters long and two neters wide over all. The firing gun does not seem to have been hit by our airplanes, but the sham one bears marks of their fire."
