DEPARTMENT OF Y. M. C. A.

The organization of a new department by the National Council of the Y. M. C. J. Annot, maritime town and country secretary, of Halifax. A secretary will be placed in each county and an intensive study of its problems will determine the work to be adopted. Among the activities will be the organization of Boy Scout troops, agricultural clubs for boys and girls, pig clubs, boys' conferences, summer camps, and the promotion through the country Sunday schools of the Standard Efficiency Training for boys in their teens.

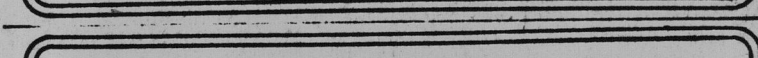
NOTICE—MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1917
MEN EXEMPTED AS FARMERS

Having in view the importance of leaving a sufficient number of men on those farms, which are actually contributing to the National Food Supply, notice is hereby given as follows:

1. ALL MEMBERS OF CLASS I POSSESSING EXEMPTION AS FARMERS which is expiring and WHO WISH TO REMAIN EXEMPT should communicate with the Registrars under the M.S.A., of their respective districts, REQUESTING AN EXTENSION IN TIME OF SUCH EXEMPTION. Questionnaires will thereupon be issued to these men by the Registrar and they will receive further exemption upon furnishing satisfactory proof that they are contributing sufficiently to the National Food Supply.

2. In order to facilitate productive employment during the Winter months, MEN EXEMPTED AS FARMERS SHOULD APPLY TO THE REGISTRARS FOR PERMITS TO ENGAGE FOR THE WINTER IN SOME OCCUPATION OF NATIONAL INTEREST, SUCH AS LUMBERING, MUNITION WORK, ETC. Such permits will serve to enable exempted farmers to pursue other useful occupations for the months during which farming operations cannot be carried on.

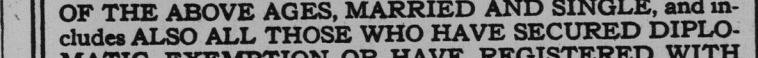


NOTICE—MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1917
REGISTRATION OF
UNITED STATES CITIZENS

Male citizens of the United States living in Canada of AGES 21-30, both inclusive, MUST REGISTER BY REGISTERED POST with the Registrar under the Military Service Act of the district in which they live, during the TEN DAYS NEXT FOLLOWING SEPTEMBER 28th, 1918; and include ALSO ALL THOSE WHO HAVE SECURED DIPLOMATIC EXEMPTION OR HAVE REGISTERED WITH AN AMERICAN CONSUL, or HAVE REGISTERED FOR MILITARY SERVICE IN THE UNITED STATES.

Registration letters may be handed to local Postmasters for despatch to the proper Registrar, under the Military Service Act.

That the Methodists of Canada were inadvertently discriminated against in the records of the overseas forces was charged by Rev. Dr. Chown at the opening session of the general conference in Hamilton yesterday. Dr. Chown said that the term Wesleyan appeared on the list, but the Wesleyan church had ceased to exist in Canada forty years ago. Owing to the omission, many Methodist recruits were not so enlisted and he challenged the totals and the relative standing of the denominations in the official reports.
