

THE LATE SHERIFF

Death Came Suddenly to S. S. deForest

A PROMINENT CITIZEN

Had Occupied Office of High Sheriff Since August 1911—Previously in Wholesale Grocery Business and Later Insurance Manager

The news of the death of Stephen S. deForest, high sheriff of St. John city and county since August 9, 1911, of which a brief announcement was made in the Times last evening, was learned with sincere regret throughout the city.

been connected with the wholesale grocery trade for the greater part of his business career, having entered this at the age of fourteen with J. & W. F. Harrison. He was afterwards one of the partners of de Forest, Harrison & Co., and had from the year 1888 to 1902 an interest in the firm of Hall & Forster, Ltd. When he left that house he set up in the wholesale grocery trade on his own account, keeping up a business in Dock street for a couple of years, after which he devoted his energies to insurance work, being manager for New Brunswick of the London and Lancashire Fire Insurance Company.

The late sheriff was appointed on August 9, 1911, by the local government to the office which he held till the time of his death, as successor to the late R. R. Ritchie, who had died suddenly on July 31. The appointment was made from a rather extensive list of applicants, among whom were the following: James Cowan, George S. Shaw, J. P. Massey, C. B. Lockhart, A. A. Wilson, K. C. J. A. Sinclair, Col. George W. Jones and S. S. de Forest.

Mr. de Forest was in his fifty-ninth year, and leaves his wife and three children, namely, George, Mrs. Walter Gilbert and Miss Mary de Forest, all of this city. Clarence W. also of St. John, and Harry W. of Boston, are his brothers. Two other sisters also survive him, Mrs. Charles Patterson and Miss E. L. de Forest, both of this city.

One of the four surviving charter members of the Union Club—with Henry J. Ritchie, Colonel Tucker and John McEwen—Stephen de Forest had also been president of the club. He was a member of St. George's Society.

As he was universally respected and popular throughout the city where he was so well known the sheriff's death will be mourned by a host of admirers and friends. Among the members of the legal profession were the life and work of Mr. de Forest especially appreciated.

The funeral will take place tomorrow at 3 o'clock from St. James' church, of which he was a member.

CONSERVATIVES URGE RESTORATION OF THE BOUNTIES ON IRON

Ottawa, March 10—Once again the Borden government hasn't been able to make up its mind. Hon. W. T. White told parliament tonight that ever since the administration took office they had been considering the question of aiding the iron industry by the granting of bounties and hadn't got through considering yet. He would consider some more, he said. The mentioning, however, it was made clear that Liberalism in parliament has a very clear-cut idea as to fiscal economic and that aid to special industries that before 1911 had been a follower of the Liberal chief.

On the other hand the high protectionists, and those who are in favor of special duties, maintained that unless bounties were given the industries could not at present continue to exist. "There is crepe on the factory chimneys all over," Mr. Carrick's jerminal on existing conditions. And this after a brief two years of the present protectionist government.

Dr. Michael Clark, of Red Deer, and Mr. MacDonnell, of Pictou, in stirring speeches, scored the minister of finance, reminding him that before 1911 he had been a follower of the Liberal chief, and that it was not consistent that he should now condemn the administration which he once supported.

Premier Borden at yesterday's sitting introduced a resolution providing for additional members of the senate from Manitoba, Alberta, and Saskatchewan.

ST. JOHN BILLS

Before Provincial Legislature—Mr. Pelletier Gives Notice of Queries—Session Lapsed Only One Hour

Fredericton, March 10—The house met at 8:40 p. m. Mr. Baxter presented the report of the committee on standing orders.

Mr. Dugal gave notice of enquiry with reference to settlement of lands at Trout River, Madawaska, also with regard to the amount paid for interest in 1907 and 1910, also as to the lack of school accommodation for colored children at Otago.

Mr. Pelletier gave notice of enquiry with regard to expenditure on N. B. Road & Railway issues of contractors on St. John & Quebec Railway; amounts paid by municipalities for keep of pauper lunatics in 1912 and since the new act came into force.

Dr. Price presented a petition of the city council of Moncton in favor of a bill to consolidate and amend law relating to levying, assessing and collecting taxes in the city; also a petition in favor of an act relating to the city of Moncton.

Mr. Humphrey presented a petition of Dorchester fire and lighting commissioners in favor of a bill to amend 1, Geo. V., Chap. 92. Mr. Granant presented a petition of the city of St. John in favor of a bill to amend the municipalities act.

Mr. Baxter introduced a bill to amend the union act of St. John and Portland. Mr. Tilley introduced a bill to exempt the harbor master of St. John from liability in certain cases and to legalize the crossing over Protection street, St. John, of the C. P. R. grain conveyor and to give power for erection of overhead crossing.

Mr. Murray introduced a bill to enable the town of Sussex to issue debentures to retire some other debentures. Hon. Mr. Wilson introduced a bill to amend the act to incorporate the N. B. Hydro-Electric Co. Ltd.

Mr. Slipp introduced a bill to incorporate the Carpenter Temperance Public Hall Company at Wickham, Queens Co. Dr. Price introduced bills to enable the city of Moncton to appoint a police magistrate; to provide for permanent improvements in the city; authorizing the issue of debentures for the construction of sidewalks and other purposes; to fix valuation of industries for taxation purposes and to enable First Moncton United Baptist church to issue debentures.

Hon. Dr. Landry presented the sixteenth annual report of the Hotel Dieu, Tracadie. The house adjourned at 4:40 p. m.
