DO NOT NEED PERMANENT ARMY OF HALF MILLION, SAYS GENERAL PERSHING

Washington, D. C., Nov. 1.—Disagreeing with war department recommendations for a permanent army of 500,000 men, General Pershing yesterday told a joint meeting of the Senate and House military committees that he thought the market place for years. The windows figure of 275,000 to 300,000 and possibly less.

The general said the regular army should be sufficient to protect the nation against sudden attack and to meet America's international obligations both on land and at sea, and that this should be backed by a "trained citizen reserve."

THE OLD MARKET HOUSE

To the Editor of the Times:—Sir:—I read in the last few issues of your paper of an agitation started by the Historical Society to repair the old Market house on the upper side of the present time this old building is in a state of rack and ruin and has been an eye-sore to the property holders of Market Place for years. The windows are falling away, in fact, the whole thing is nothing but a battered old invader shack, which would cost something like four or five thousand dollars to put in a presentable state. After this expenditure the historical value for the place would diminish with modern building material, and as it is almost surrounded by a lumber yard, and a stone's throw from a sardine factory, it would hardly prove "a thing of beauty and a joy forever."

It would be far more profitable for the city to tear down this ancient ruin and devote any money which might be expended on its repair to a permanent paving of a few of our west side streets, or a few more substantial sidewalks. This would be of more benefit to the present and future generations.
