

SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE.

In the case of

No. C-34003. Private. Edmour Laverdure of the Canadian Forestry Corps, (CA) attached to A.(I).F.C. A-13, is charged with;

WHEN ON ACTIVE SERVICE.
DESERTING HIS MAJESTY'S
SERVICE.

The C.O. directs that the evidence be taken on oath.

FIRST WITNESS:

Major C.A. Rogers, of the Canadian Forestry Corps, (CA) attached to A.(I).F.C. A-13, as C.O. of the C.F.C. Training Wing, being duly sworn, states;

On the 30th day of December 1941, I went to Drill Hall No 255 of the A.(I).F.C. A-13 and read in French and English the draft warning order to the men on parade who were asked if there were any questions. No. C-34003 Pte. Laverdure E. was on this parade. The parade was then turned over to Lieut. J. Larsen who witnessed each man's signature. I hereby produce the said warning signed by the accused and witnessed by Lieut. Larsen. The draft for which Pte. Laverdure was warned left Valcartier Camp on the 7th day of January while Pte. Laverdure was absent without leave.



SECOND WITNESS:

Lieut. J. Larsen, of the Canadian Forestry Corps, (CA) attached to A.(I).F.C. A-13, being duly sworn, states;

On the 30th day of December 1941, I heard Major C.A. Rogers, C.O., of the Canadian Forestry Training Wing, read a warning order for overseas service in English and French to men in hut 255 of the A.(I).F.C. A-13. No. C-34003. Pte. E. Laverdure was on this parade. He signed the warning order I witnessed his signature.
