COAL SITUATION. Prospect of More Anthracite Coming Forward Very Soon. Operators Promise to Favor the East and the New England States—Some Evidence That Will Go Before the United States Commission at Once.

Scranton, Pa., Jan. 4.—Following the lead of the Lehigh Valley, the Jersey Central and the Reading companies, the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Co. yesterday acceded to the demand of its contract shippers to suspend the 45-cent per cent contract until circular and actual market prices again conform.

Only about half of the independent operators are coming under the contract. They have had to be content with 65 per cent of 30 on big small sizes, the arbitrary figure fixed by the carriers for coal at tide-water.

The contract independents argued that it was unfair that they should be bound by an arbitrary price when other independents were getting all that the law of supply and demand allows.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 4.—The answer of G. B. Markle & Co., independent coal operators, was made here today. The answer was submitted to the anthracite strike commission, which has been set up to investigate the coal situation.
