Sackville Man Meets with a Painful Accident—Damage Done by Lightning—News from Mt. Allison.

Sackville, May 31.—A heavy thunderstorm visited the town on Monday evening. The only damage done was to the concrete floor of B. C. Raworth's brick carriage factory, the lightning entering the open door and making a large hole in the concrete.
