

BOTSFORD, Hon. Amos Edwin, J. P.

Is Chairman of the Provincial Board of Agriculture, N. B. Became a mem. of the Ex. Council, N. B., 1840. Was a mem. of the Leg. Council, N. B., before the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—*Westcock, Westmorland, N. B.*

BUREAU, Hon. Jacque Olivier, N. P., J. P. L.

Family originally came from Normandy to Quebec, and subsequently removed to Montreal. B. at Three Rivers, P. Q. Sat for Napierville in Leg. Assembly, Can., from g. e. 1854 until Sept., 1862, when elected for DeLorimier Division, Leg. Council, which he represented until the Union. Was Provincial Secy., Can., from Jany. to May, 1863.—*St. Rémi, P. Q.*

BURNHAM, Hon. Asa Allworth, J. P. C.

Ancestors came from England to one of the New England States, (where his father was born) before the Am. Revolution. S. of the late Hon. Z. Burnham, who came to Canada in 1796. B. on site of the present town of Cobourg, Ont., 1808. Ed. in Canada and New York. M. in 1832, Elizabeth, dau. of Saml. Street Wilmot, Esq., of Clarke, Co. Durham, Ont. Has been engaged in agricultural pursuits since 1823. Appointed a commissioner for trying cases of small debts, 1832. Elected for several years President of the Board of Police of Cobourg. Was Warden
