N.B. In the foregoing short report, or opinion, of the attorney general of the province of Quebec, the particulars of the plan therein recommended for the administration of justice in the province of Quebec are not set forth, but only the general substance of it is briefly mentioned in these words:

"What he has principally observed to be the subject of the complaints of the Canadians has been either the expence or the dilatoriness of our law-proceedings, which he therefore conceives stand in need of reformation: and he is of opinion, that to establish three courts of general jurisdiction, in all matters criminal as well civil, in the province, to sit every week in the year (with a very sew exceptions) in the towns of Quebec, Three Rivers, and Montreal, would be the most adequate remedy for these complaints." Now the particulars of this plan are as follows.
