School, and by private tutor. M., 1845, Charlotte, second dau. of Peter Carman, Esq., Iroquois, and grand-dau. of the late Peter Shaver, Esq., who represented the Co. Dundas in the U.C. Legislature for sixteen years. Municipal Councillor for ten years; is Reeve and a J.P.; Clerk of the Division Court. Chairman of the High School Board for fifteen years. Commr. in B.R. President of the Iroquois Milling Co. Was elected in 1861 to U.C. Legislature for Co. Dundas; re-elected 1863, and again, to Dominion Parl., by acclamation, in 1867. Defeated in 1872. Re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative Liberal; thoroughly Canadian; opposed to the Govt. constructing and working railroads. In favour of limiting the rate of interest. Opposed to the Bankrupt Law. Holds that the Pacific Railway should have received Imperial aid, and is in favour of special arrangements with [other] countries in trade matters.—*Iroquois, Co. Dundas, Ont.*

ROULEAU, FRANCOIS FORTUNAT, *B.C.L.* (*Dorchester.*)

S. of Lieut. Col. Francois Rouleau, N.P., Registrar of Dorchester, by Luce Labonté. B. at Ste. Claire, P.Q., 4 July 1849. Ed. at the Laval Normal School, Quebec, and at the Laval University, where he obtained the degree of B.C.L., 1870. M., 8 May 1878, M. J. J. Alphonsine, dau. of J. W. Peachy, Esq., Customs Department, Ottawa. Called to the Bar, P.Q., 1870. First returned to Parl. for present seat at g.e. 1874. Unseated on petition, 8 July 1875; re-elected 14 Dec. 1875, and again at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Donnacona Street, Quebec.*

ROUTHIER, FELIX, *J.P.* (*Prescott.*)

Fourth s. of the late Charles Routhier, farmer, of St. Placide, Two Mountains Co., P.Q. B. 21 May. 1827 at St. Placide. Ed. at the Public Schools. M., 9 July 1849, at St. Benoit, Two Mountains Co., Angélique Delorme dit Lemay. Is a manufacturer, Justice of the Peace, a Major, V.I., and Mayor of the Municipality of St. Placide. First returned to Parl. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Vankleek Hill, Ont.*
