## BILL.

An Act to incorporate the St. Mary's College of Montreal.

HEREAS Monseigneur, Ignace, Roman Catholic Bishop of Preamble. Montreal, Felix Martin, H. Durauguet, A. Larcher, A. Havequez, Adolphe Larcher and Jas. Durshaller, have by their petition to the Legislature, represented that a College hath been 5 established at Montreal for the education of youth, and have prayed that corporate powers be conferred on the said College, and in consideration of the great advantages to be derived from the said establishment, it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That the said College, which shall be composed of the Roman College incor-10 Catholic Bishop of Montreal, the present Rector of the College, of whom the and his successors, the Professors and the Bursar of the said Corporation shall consist. College, and their successors, together with all such other necessary officers as may be hereafter appointed under the provisions of this Act, and their several and respective successors, shall be 15 and is hereby constituted a Body Politic and Corporate in deed and in name, by and under the name of " La Corporation du Col- Corporate lege Ste. Marie à Montreul," and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power from time to time to alter, renew or change such common seal at their pleasure, and shall by the same name from time to time and at all times hereafter be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy, and to have, take and receive to them and their successors to and for the uses and purposes of the said Corporation, any lands, tenements and hereditaments and real or 25 immoveable property and estate, situate lying and being within this Province not exceeding in yearly value the sum of one thousand Real property five hundred pounds currency, and the same to sell, alienate, and limited. dispose of, and to purchase others in their stead for the same pur-

pose; and by the said name shall and may be able and capable in law 30 to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto in all courts of law and places whatsoever, in as large, ample and beneficial a manner as any other body politic or corporate, or as any persons able or capable in law may or can sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be
