C A P. XXIV.

An Act for allowing, until the First Day of *August*  
One thousand eight hundred and eight, the Importation of certain Fish from *Newfoundland* and the Coast of *Labrador*, and for granting a Bounty thereon.  
[17th March 1807.]

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to permit the Importation of Salted and Pickled Salmon, and Salted dried Cod Fish from the Island of *Newfoundland* and the Coast of *Labrador*, into the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*, and to allow, on such Importation, a Bounty on every Quintal or Hundred Weight of such Fish so imported; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful to import from the Island of *Newfoundland* or the Coast of *Labrador*, into the United Kingdom, any Salted or Pickled Salmon, or Salted dry Cod Fish, having been taken and cured at the said Places, or either of them, by *British* Subjects; any Law, Custom, or Usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Salted Salmon or salted Cod may be imported from Newfoundland, &c.
