The Department is desirous of securing a small tract of land on the south shore of Cold Lake, in Township 63, Ranges 1 and 2, West of the Fourth Meridian, as an Indian reserve for the Cold Lake band of Indians.

The said tract of land is required principally for a fishing station. If desired a portion of the Cold Lake Indian reserve will be surrendered in exchange.

I shall feel obliged if you will be good enough to reserve the land from sale or settlement along the south shore of the said lake, situated within the Township, until this Department is able to arrive at a decision in the matter, and to have the necessary surveys made.
