

Ottawa, 8th February, 1919.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 30th January I beg to say that Moyse Rose or Ross was paid annuity in 1908 under No 100, of Jack Head Band. He was paid for himself, his wife, two boys and one girl. A note in the pay-list states the man came from 174 of the Broken Head Band, and that his wife came from No 94 of the Jack Head Band.

Reference to the Broken Head pay-list shows that the following payments were made under No 174 :-

1907	-	-	-	-	"Absent. Married to M. Duff of Jack Head. Wife paid there under No 94."
1908	1	1	2	1	"Paid under No 100 Jack Head."

From the above it would appear that Ross is entitled to arrears of annuity for himself for 1904, and for himself and 2 children for 1907. Kindly refer this matter to Agent Goldclough, and request him to submit vouchers for payment of the amount of annuity due as shown.
