Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter, dated yesterday, the 9th inst. together with the enclosed document of M^{rs} Jos. Tarant, Jos. Morrin, and W. A. Hall, relative to a certificate qualifying M^r Smith to the practice of Medicine, Surgery, Midwifery forwarded to you, for the purpose of obtaining a licence, and purporting that the said certificate was done when there was no Quorum of the Medical Board, and of course illegal.

You express in the same time, the desire of his Lordship's, the Governor in Chief, to obtain such observations and explanations on the subject, as the Board may have to offer.

I beg to say in answer to this part of your letter, that it is a matter of great difficulty to assemble the Medical Board between the legal meetings; many Members residing in the Country, and at some distance.

Nevertheless, I shall call an extraordinary Meeting, with as little delay as possible, that the Board may take your letter and its enclosure into their consideration.
