A number of the younger Indians wish to dispose of the timber on their individual lots, at the price offered by the Company. Could this be done without sharing the proceeds of the sales with each and every member of the Band, and if sold for \$3.50 per thousand, what portion of the money would be retained by the Department at Ottawa? The Lucium wish he have.
