

Reserve at the Salmon Flat.

4-5 inches of water per 2 all other claims from all available sources of water supply.

Little Shuswap Lake Indians

(in Aug. 1877)
A Reserve extending from the Great Shuswap Lake across the neck of land to the Little Shuswap Lake and down the Western shore of the Lake about two miles.

A small timber Reserve at the E.E. corner of Little Shuswap Lake

A tract of land of about 20 acres about 3/2 miles up Jones Creek from the Kamloops River.

A Reserve at the mouth of Scotch Creek, Great Shuswap Lake.

The Joint Commission allotted and confirmed, as far as they had authority, to the Little Shuswap Lake Indians all the water they may require from streams ^{such as} Scotch Creek and from a Lake in the high lands at the S.W. portion of the Reserve on West side of Little Shuswap Lake.

A Reserve at the mouth of the Salmon River on Salmon Arm, Great Shuswap Lake with a Pontage on the Lake of about 1/2 mile to the East and 3/2 miles to the West. Dated 1877
