mands your affistance: nor will you regard with inattention the want of Roads, of Communication, and of such Public Buildings and Establishments as are absolutely necessary towards carrying on business of Government on a system of regularity and responsibility.

"I have ordered the Public Accounts and Estimates to be laid before you, by which you will see that your immediate exigencies are far beyond your present Revenue; and I have every hope that the event of your deliberations will give proper efficacy to the natural advantages of this Island; and place it upon that respectable foundation on which it justly merits to stand.

"Gentlemen of the House of Representatives,

Though the accession of new Settlers and the improvements which have taken place in the Colony since the last Session, have been as numerous as at any former period of equal time; yet it's advancement creeps but very slowly, and, will continue to do so untill the exertions of the legislature shall quicken its pace; those exertions shall allways meet my cordial cooperation, and I have no doubt but they will in a short time render this Island a valuable acquisition to His Majesty's most gracious, Government of Council Chamber, Charlotte Town, 1st Dec. 1806.
