**GERMANY THE VICTIM OF ITS PAST**

Prof. J.L. Morrison of Queen's University Explains to the Canadian Club How the Past History of Germany Led Inevitably to the Conflict of the Present War.

(From Wednesday's Daily.) J. L. Morrison, M.A., professor of history in Queen's University, Kingston was the guest of honor at last night's meeting of the Canadian Club. There was an unusually large attendance and those who came were repaid by hearing one of the ablest and most convincing addresses in the history of the club. He subject was, "Prussian Diplomacy and Militarism—an Historical and Explanatory Criticism."

HOHENZOLLERN FAMILY. In Great Britain when we sing "God Save the King" we are conscious of a partnership between the king and the people. It was very different in Prussia where we saw such democratic partnership.

SCHEDULED TO MEET THEIR ENDS. To attain their ends the Prussian rulers had to resort to schemes and cunning. Frederick the Great believed that a despotism was necessary to unite Germany. As a despot he could not follow the ordinary rules of morality.

THE TRANSITION OF 1861. Frederick William the Third who occupied the throne of Prussia up to 1861 was a different type of Hohenzollern. He was honorable in his foreign relations and did not lie or cheat or steal.
