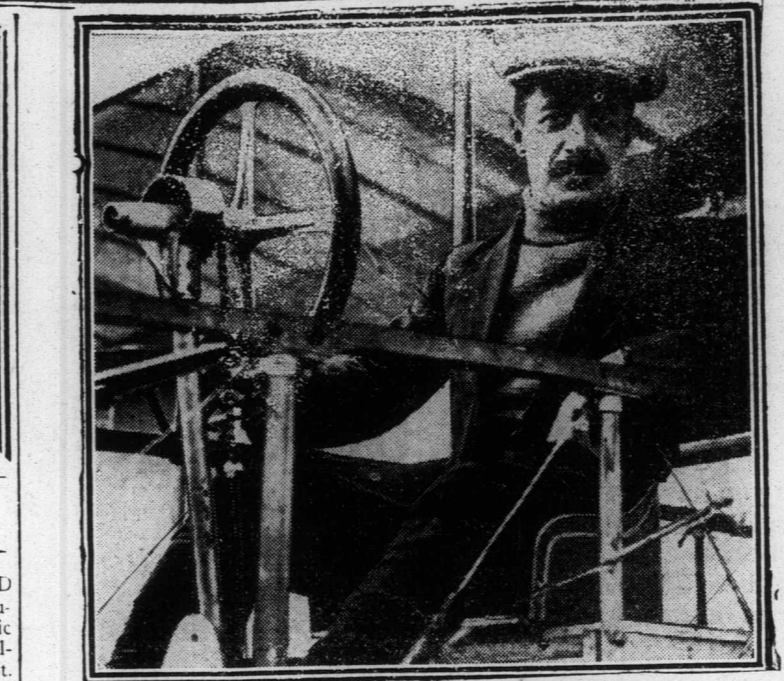

## INFANT PLAGUE ALARMS U. S.

### Nation Wide Medical Survey to Be Taken to Throt the Epidemic.

New York, Aug. 11.—The Government of the United States, in conjunction with municipal, county and state health officers in practically every community in the country, is planning the most complete medical survey ever taken.

The purpose of the movement, which is comparable in magnitude to a national census, is to throt the epidemic of infantile paralysis and to prevent further epidemics.

Two eminent surgeons of the Public Health Service—Doctors Charles E. Banks and C. H. Lavinder—left the Hotel Martiniere last night for Washington upon the telegraphed summons of Surgeon-General Rupert Blue.

With twenty-eight other federal physicians, Drs. Banks and Lavinder have been giving yeoman aid to New York in its fight against the plague.

Simultaneously with their departure the government has decided to consider the disease as a national menace. This decision was arrived at because of the increasing spread of the foot of the disease. The poliomyelitis, hicro-river and bids' fair to become epidemic.

Drs. Lavinder and Banks will discuss with Surgeon-Gen. Blue and Assistant Surgeon-Gen. Rucker, measures of investigation that will embrace millions of children throughout the country.

For the first time efforts will be made to place the disease on a mathematical basis. Certain definite requests will be made of representatives of various states and cities who will attend the infantile paralysis conference in Washington next Thursday.

The requests, based largely upon epidemiological work in New York and elsewhere, will include the following:

What age groups in your community are most susceptible to the disease? What racial or other preference has the disease shown? Is there any clearly established connection between the disease and the milk and water supply? Do milk and water seem to transmit the germs as in typhoid fever? Has the disease in your community been coincidental with an increase in other children's diseases?

In order to make necessary surveys, the government will request aid to local officials just as it did in New York. A co-ordination of quarantine regulations will be another probable result of the conference in the city and a dangerous increase in the suburbs adjoining states marked the plague's progress yesterday.

There were 28 deaths and 175 new cases in Greater New York; total deaths, 1,298; total cases, 5,822. Sixty cases—a new record—were reported to the State Health Department from places outside the city.

State totals are: Cases, 856; deaths 79.

### DEAN STARR AS CHAPLAIN

Militia Department Has Permitted Him to Go to the Front.

Kingston, Aug. 11.—Dean Starr, who holds the militia rank of Major, left this afternoon for Halifax, acting upon instructions from the Militia Department, which has acceded to his request to permit him to go to the front as a chaplain. He offered his services free. Dean Starr was with the British forces for a short time during the early stages of the war. His place at St. George's Cathedral will be taken by Prof. H. T. F. Duckworth, of Trinity College, Toronto.

TO BRIDGEPORT

Toronto, Aug. 11.—The Toronto Baseball Club has released Pitcher Russell, the Cornell student, to the Bridgeport club, in order that he may get more seasoning and experience.

Shortstop Smith is at present at Pittsburg, and wires that he cannot see Bonsetter Reese until Saturday.

He has been wired to report to the Toronto club at Richmond or stand suspended.

## Onondaga Council in Regular Session

Middleport, Aug. 7.—The Council met in Mitchell Hall at 1.30 p.m., all the members being present.

The Ancaster agreement and By-law regarding town line road were received by first reading and then was laid over for next meeting by request of the Reeve.

The Council took a recess to inspect some bridges over the first and second concessions north of the village.

On resuming, the Council reported that it was advisable to build two concrete bridges, one 16 ft. at Knox's, one 18 ft. at Mulligans, and one 18 ft. at Patterson's. On motion it was decided to have plans drawn up at once and ask for tenders which will be opened on Thursday, Aug. 17, at 8 p.m. Plans and specifications to be seen at the residence of A. B. Rose.

The Council adjourned to meet for assessment for school and township purposes are nearly the same as last year, but the County asks (which include Water Tax) for \$2,800. The assessment for school and township will therefore be considerably higher.

The majority were "whiskey" bottles, which were eagerly snapped up by the manufacturers of various brands, who have had pressed of late owing to the shortage of this class of stock, the impossibility of obtaining supplies from Germany, which had secured almost a monopoly of the glass bottle industry.
