**LOCAL SUMMARY.**  
**ATHENS AND NEIGHBORING LOCALITIES BRIEFLY WRITTEN UP.**  
Events as Seen by Our Knight of the Pen—See Announcements Boiled Right Down.

Mr. Beatty has commenced surveying for a plan of the village.  
There are at present 25 bodies in the Athens vault, 13 males and 12 females.  
A market train that carries nothing to market is about as useful as a motor that won't move.  
Mr. J. Ross has let his gallery to an experienced photographer who will commence business here next week.  
The village council will meet for the transaction of business at the town hall, on Monday next, at 8 p. m.  
At the Methodist Sabbath School on Sunday last there was an attendance of 241, made up of 102 males and 139 females.  
On Tuesday, 4th of February, T. P. Moffat, of Rocksping, will sell by auction four horses, cutter, buggy, etc. at 11 a. m.  
Rev. J. J. Wright, B. A., who has accepted a call to preach at Lynn, conducted service here on Sabbath last, and very favorably impressed his congregation. He is an eloquent, earnest preacher of the word, and is to be congratulated upon having secured so good a man.

On Sunday morning the funeral of William Broad took place from the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Geo. Slack, to the Methodist church where Rev. Mr. Wilson conducted service after which the remains were placed in the vault to await interment. He ceased his earthly journey on last New Year's day.  
The many friends of the Misses Madden in this place will regret to learn of the death of their father which occurred suddenly at Delta on Sunday. For past two years Mr. Madden had been suffering from an affection of the nerves. The funeral took place this (Tuesday) afternoon and was attended by a number of Masonic friends from Athens.  
Rev. Mr. Stevenson, of Brockville, who died on Wednesday last, was interred at that place on Saturday afternoon. **THE APPLIANT.**  
As the principles of ventilation and their application are better understood and the effect of temperature on the humidity of the atmosphere in cellars becomes better known, but culture will be reduced to a simplicity unthought of at present. If we paid attention to the temperature of our rooms we might accumulate health, comfort and longevity. The most of living apartments at this season, have a temperature of from 80 to 100 degrees. When this we step out doors a few minutes repeatedly, each time plunging into an air bath of from 15 to 20 degrees below freezing. So long as the temperature of the room remains, remain a scourge to whip common sense into the people.  
There is little hope of a change unless the medical profession give lessons and persistently insist on their observance. As a matter of fact, the use of bee-keepers, chaff, straw, or other packing material as an absorbent will find in many cases that it is sufficient to reduce the humidity to a point where it is not objectionable. In this case removal from the room the bees to give an inch open space under the sides of the hives for 5 or 6 inches, leaving the material under the bottom. It will also be found that the absorbent material is much the same condition that it is when the bees are set out in the spring. When this is done close the cloth back to its place.
