"Cool-Headed, Quiet Chap, Who Minds His Own Business.

Color-Sergeant P. Freemantle, messenger in the Imperial Bank, has been in "D" Company of the Royal Grenadiers for twenty years, and has never met a squarer, better head that Pte. S. J. Perry, G.M. It was in '99 at the Long Branch ranges that Mr. Freemantle became intimate with Perry as a marksman. Perry was

Perry as a marksman. Perry was then a member of Freemantle's team, selected for his good regimental shooting, says The Toronto News. "Yes, I knew Perry in Africa," said the sergeant. "I was under canvas with him at Belmont and under smoke with him a good many other places, including Paardeberg."
"Did Perry eye get a bullet down 'Did Perry ever get a bullet down there?'

"No. He hurt his knee scrambling over a kopie at Houtnek on the road to Winborg though. That was about May 3rd, 1900, I guess. He got invalided to Cape Town from there.
