

DECLARES MEN TO BE CLEANER POLITICAL FIGHTERS THAN WOMEN

First Woman Mayor or Mayoress
of State of Illinois Makes Bit-
ing Observations

Warren, Ill., June 28.—"Men are cleaner political fighters than women are; women are more jealous than men; women are hastier in their judgment than men; women are less forgiving than men; women are more vindictive than men."

No; you're dead wrong. That isn't propaganda sent out by the National Association Opposed to Woman Suffrage. Those rather biting observations came today from no less a personage than the first woman mayor or mayoress of the State of Illinois ever produced, and a life-long fighter for suffrage for women.

That word "personage" was carefully chosen. Mrs. A. R. Canfield, mayoress of Warren, is one of these things. Unless you knew what she was going to accomplish, and that she is the mayor, you'd never think of her. She's about the most lovable, snuggly kind of grand-motherly looking old lady you'd want to meet. She's seventy-five and brags about it. Everyone here calls her "the Good Grandmother"—and she brags about that, justifiably.

Nobody actually took Mrs. Canfield's candidacy seriously, except herself. There were, naturally, a majority of the voters who wanted to see her elected. But they didn't know they were in the majority until the votes count sent "the Good Grandmother" to the mayor's chair, for which Mrs. Canfield most of the time substitutes a comfortable rocker. Then when her election was certain the vicious elements cheered. They cheered too soon. Here are some of the things Mrs. Canfield has stopped:

Suggestive and sensational movies; improperly conducted dances; park spooning, and to a great extent automobile speeding through Warren. She has also carried the fighting to liquor sellers until they're out of breath and helping her stop the sale of liquor to already intoxicated men. Here are some of the things she is going to give Warren:

Public superintended dancing halls; public readings for young and old; a centrally established hall to be a meeting place and house of entertainment for everyone.

"Some of the women who opposed my election," said Mrs. Canfield, "used weapons I never supposed they possessed. They actually accused me of stealing."

The astounding part of it was that some of these women were leaders in the Y. M. C. A. movement.

"Many opposed me because I believe in young folks dancing. The evil even in the modern dances is not the steps or movements, but in the minds of the dancers. Surround them with proper environment and the dancers won't think evil."

"I am firmly convinced that Chicago some day in the near future will have a woman mayor. When that comes, Chicago will have the best municipal government in the world."

MARRIED WOMAN TO GET HER MONEY BACK FROM MAN

Toronto Victim of Swindler Also
Granted Annulment of the
Contract

Toronto, June 29.—"He told me he had a beautiful \$50,000 home in Los Angeles, that I never would have to lift a finger in the future and that he would open his home to my crippled son," said Mrs. Anna A. Anderson, in Supreme Court at Buffalo, N.Y., as she told to Justice Marcus the story of how she was swindled out of \$2,100. Mrs. Anderson, a middle-aged woman, told how she answered a matrimonial advertisement in a Toronto newspaper and received letters from a "middle-aged bachelor, of good appearance and an honest man." The advertisement appeared in June, 1914.

"The man, who gave his name as J. C. Anderson, met me and had dinner at my home in Toronto," said Mrs. Anderson. "He told me he was buying horses for the Japanese government."

"We went to Niagara Falls on June 20th and were married. A few days later he told me he had to go to Lexington, Ky., for a few days to buy a beautiful horse. He asked me to let him have some money, saying he couldn't wait to write to his home in Los Angeles for it."

"I mortgaged my home for \$2,500 and let him have \$2,100 of it. He disappeared and I never saw him again."

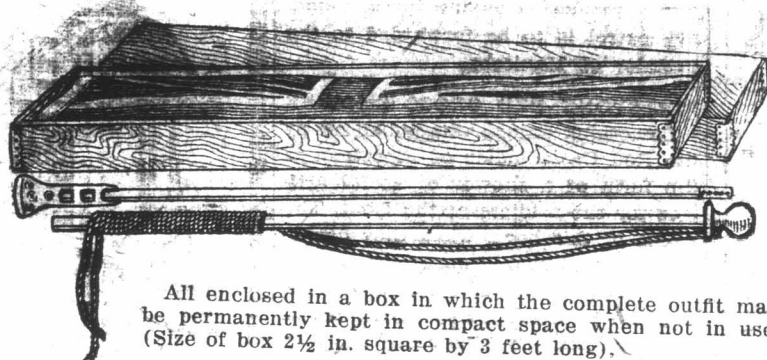

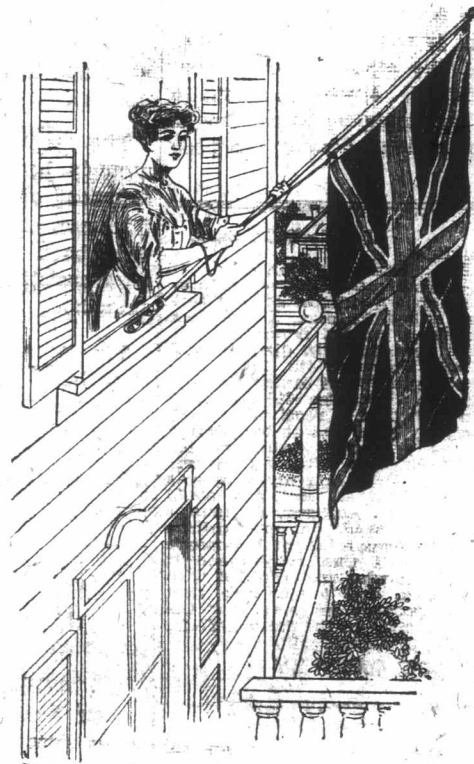
