On Tuesday afternoon last, the 20th inst., [The following plan will give some idea of the greater portion of the village of Gibson the locality : wayswept by a storm of fire and completely annihilated

The fire originated in a barn belonging to Arthur Sewell, just south of the old Woodford Smith property. In a few minutes Mr. Sewell's large dwelling house was in flames. The next to go was the Harry Currie house occupied by Alex. Heron. The Malcolm Brown residence caught next and the fire became general on the river or west side of the street. The double tenement owned by James McMurray carried the ues across the street to the widow Neill's alling, and both sides of the main street, mallel with the river, was a mass of smoke and flame. The fire swept over the village in about two hours, destroying eighty-four dwellings, with an equal number of barns, two new churches, five stores, C. P. R. round-house, station and tunnel, blacksmith shops, fences, sidewalks, in fact everything that could be burned.

It was about a quarter to three o'clock when the alarm was made; most of the men were away at work, some at the Phœnix mills, at the Douglas boom, at Marysville and Fredericton, so that there was no assistance to fight the flames nor save movable property. Help arrived from the city, a detachment of the fire brigade and the infantry school men under Lieut. McDonald, rendered efficient aid and through their efforts, with those of the St. Marys firemen, Babbitt's mills, Hallet and Logan dwellings, Methodist church and W. H. White's tene ment were saved.

The roaring of the flames, the dense smoke, the shouts of the excited men and the screams of affrighted women and children made it a pandemonium indeed. The very heavy wind and the extreme dryness of everything made it impossible to do anything to stop the progress of the fire, and all turned their attention to saving what




