

AROUND THE CITY

LOCALS.

It is reported that the firm of Foley Bros., wholesale grocers, Winnipeg, are about to open a branch in Edmonton. The C.P.R. ticket office advise that the steamship "Lake Manitoba" will arrive in Quebec about noon on Saturday.

At the office of the building inspector this morning, E. R. Dickson took a permit for a house of Government avenue lot 4, block 9, R.L. 16-18, to cost \$2,200. Several car loads of steel and material for the superstructure of the G. T. P. bridge at Clover Bar arrived in the city yesterday and are being taken out to the bridge, where work will begin shortly.

The families of section 2, W. 8th and J. W. Ziegler, with his wife and children, from Missouri, are at the Immigration Hall at present. They are loading a car of effects yesterday and will go west to look for suitable homestead land on which to locate.

The first ripe tomatoes grown out here were brought into the Bulletin office yesterday afternoon by W. J. Wilson, corner of Heimick and First streets. The tomatoes were picked on August 1st and are perfectly ripe and solid.

President F. H. Morse, of the G. T. P., is expected to be in the city this week. He was at the end of the Battle river last Sunday and returned from there to Winnipeg, intending to come to Edmonton later in the week.

A number of sub-contractors on the G.T.P. west of the city spent yesterday at Edmonton, and went out to Stony Plain to-day with their families. A force of 25 men also went out today to work on the Canadian-Winnipeg grading contract fifty miles west of here.

The Edmonton Board of Trade are asking for samples of vegetables for the Twin City Exhibit at the Toronto exhibition at the Toronto Exhibition, and are prepared to purchase the same. Full particulars will be obtained at the Board of Trade rooms on First street.

As an evidence of the interest being taken by English capitalists in this province, the Western Photo Co. have received an order from parties in London, Eng., who are financially interested in Alberta, for views of the province, and particularly in Edmonton. These will be used to interest other English investors in this part of the Canadian west.

OLD HOTEL MAN HERE. Frank Mariaggi, one of the best known hotel proprietors in Western Canada, arrived in the city yesterday from Corsica, and is a guest at the Alberta hotel. Several years ago Mr. Mariaggi was proprietor of the Alberta hotel, before the city had assumed its present pretentious size. He also conducted a hotel at one time at Fort Saskatchewan. Until recently he was proprietor of the Mariaggi hotel at Winnipeg and another at Port Arthur. He still has extensive business in the West, and is in Edmonton on a pleasure and business trip to mark the growth and development of the Canadian West.

DISTRICT COURT CASES. At the District Court this morning the case of J. Randall & McKay vs. the Massey-Harris Co. came up for hearing before His Honor Judge H. C. Taylor, and the defendant appeared with this afternoon. This action was instituted by the plaintiffs to recover the cost of several repairs on an engine house constructed by them for the defendants. H. H. Robertson is appearing for the plaintiffs, and O. M. Biggar for the defendants.

Yesterday the case of Geo. I. Keen vs. Jackson was heard in court. This was an action by the plaintiff for specific performance of a contract. The defendant, Jackson, is a contractor on the G.T.P. grade west of Edmonton. He contracted with Keen to supply him with 125 tons of hay. After receiving 100 tons, he refused to take the remainder of the hay, and the plaintiff applied to the court for judgment for the hay, who was to deliver the balance of the hay whenever it was required.

The case of the Grundy Music Co. vs. Smith was decided in favor of the plaintiff for \$135.19.

SANDFORD VS. MURRAY. His Lordship Mr. Justice Stuart gave judgment for the plaintiff in the case of Sanford vs. Murray, which was tried at the last sitting of the Supreme Court in Edmonton. This was an action by the assignee, Dora Sanford, of a purchaser of John B. Sanford, under an agreement for the sale of land against the vendor, Frank Murray, for the specific performance of a contract.

The agreement in question was dated April 26th, 1907, the purchase price being \$700. This was to be paid \$350 cash, \$175 on October 26th, 1907, and \$175 on April 26th, 1908, with interest at 8 per cent. The agreement contained provisions importing to authorize the vendor to cancel the agreement and forfeit all payments made on account of the purchase money "by written notice to that effect personally served on the purchaser or mailed to him or his authorized agent." The \$350 payments were made under the agreement, but none of the subsequent payments were made.

The plaintiff admitted the notice of cancellation of the agreement sent by Murray to J. B. Sanford by letter on November 4th, 1907. Murray entered into a new agreement for the sale of the land by one Gordon before the plaintiff.

WORK ON STREET CAR LINE. Details in connection with the Edmonton and Strathcona street railways are daily being arranged at the office of the city commissioners and up to the present everything has been running smoothly and without hitch. The question of whether the trolley wires along Jasper avenue should be carried on one pole with brackets attached or by means of two lines of poles, one on each side, with brackets attached to the street has been considered and the one line arrangement has been adopted for the present. In Strathcona, where the construction work has to be done to the satisfaction of the city council, they are insisting on the double pole system all the way from the bridge up to and along Whyte avenue.

March 2nd, 1908, shortly after which he received notice from Mr. Sternberg, agent of the plaintiff, of his intention to pay the arrears. HARDWARE MEN ORGANIZE. A few weeks ago some of the leading hardware merchants of the province met in Calgary and formed the Alberta Hardware Merchants' association. The purpose of the organization are to provide mutual protection in legislative movements, to do away with injudicious cutting and to protect their interests, to secure a higher protection on credits and to bring about a better understanding and intercourse between hardware merchants of the province.
