Social Service Congress.

ST. JOHN'S, NOVEMBER 17TH-19TH. The Social Service Congress which was originally planned for the month of October has been postponed until November 17th, 1919, owing to the fact that some of the speakers who plan to take part in the meetings could not be here any earlier. The Congress will be similar in character to that held here two years ago, when Dr. Hastings Hart of New York, Alexander Johnson of Philadelphia, and Canon Tucker of London, Ontario, were here and made such a favourable impression upon the public. This year there is to be a different, though not less distinguished, list of speakers. Dr. Worth M. Tippy, one of the most noted Social Service Experts of America, has promised to visit us. At present he is in attendance at the Conference of the Church Peace Union at the Hague, but expects to return to America about the end of this month. It will be a great opportunity to hear him.

Dr. Clarence Hinks is another member of the visiting team. He is the Director of the Canadian National Committee for Mental Hygiene, and is a distinguished member of the medical profession. Both these men are very interesting platform speakers.

Rev. Canon Vernon, General Secretary of the Anglican Council for Social Service, formerly Editor of "Church Work," is also a new man to Newfoundland audiences. He is a well-informed and capable speaker and it will mean much to have him at the Congress.

The other members of the party are Dr. J. S. Shearer, and Dr. T. Albert Moore, who are both well known here, having been present at the last Congress and also on other occasions when they have always been well received by our people.

Further notice of the Congress will be given in the press from time to time. In addition to the above several well known local speakers will take part in the Congress.
