A very useful analysis of the party constitution of the French Chamber has just appeared. It is based upon a classification of the various newspapers of Paris. The Ultramontane party, represented by the *Univers*, consists of thirty members; the Ultramontane Legitimist of thirty members, represented by the *Monde*; the Legitimist-Ultramontane of seventy members, represented by the *Union* and the *Gazette de France*; the Orleanist (Right Centre) of 120 members represented by the *Journal de Paris*; the Jesuitical Monarchist of thirty members, represented by the *Debat*; the Conservative Republican (Left Centre) of 140 members, represented by the *Bien Public*, *Le Soir*, etc.; the Radical of 180 members, represented by *La Republique Francaise*; and the Extreme Radical of forty members, represented by *Le Rappel*. This list, with twenty Bonapartists, makes 910 out of the 720 members of the Assembly.
