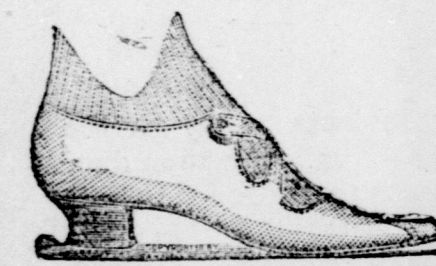

Toronto, Nov. 19-11 p.m. - A distur-
bance of importance which has developed
rapidly during the day now covers Lake
Ontario, and pressure is high over the
upper lakes and in southwest States. Snow
is falling heavily over Northern Ontario,
attended by a gale of wind and rain over
the southern portion. In the Northwest
Territories the weather has turned milder,
with local snow falls.

THE WATER COMMISSIONERS.

The regular semi-monthly meeting
of the water commissioners was held
in the City Hall yesterday afternoon,
with Messrs. Cowan (chairman), and
Judd, Engineer Moore, Inspector Plas-
tow and Secretary Ellwood in atten-
dance. Mr. Moore recommended that
a two-inch main be laid on Wellington
street, north of Cheapside, as request-
ed by Mr. W. G. McKenna. The cost
would be about \$120. The revenue from
the consumers in the block would
amount to \$70 at least, a year.

"But in time all these small pipes
will have to be taken up," said Mr.
Judd.

"Yes, in about ten years," replied
Engineer Moore; "but they pay for
themselves in less time than that."

The main will be laid.

tary Ellwood, asked for leave of ab-
sence beginning Dec. 1, so that he could
visit the old country. The request was

vate residences. Inspector Plastow had
also heard one consumer complain
about his motor.
