

DAILY HISTORY OF BASEBALL

MONDAY, MAY 15.

1889 Jesse Burkett, now Worcester's manager and then pitching for the Atlantic Association Club of that city, held Newark to one hit in thirteen innings.

1894 Fire destroyed the Boston National League Club's grounds, the Baltimore and Boston teams being playing at the time.

1897 Cy Seymour, George Dayls and Jake Beckley, of the Giants, made a triple play in the game with Cincinnati. Seymour now is with Baltimore, Beckley is the manager of the Hannibal, Mo., club, and Dayls is managing Des Moines.

1898 The Texas League disbanded for lack of patronage.

1899 Jim Delehanty, now with Detroit and then playing shortstop for the Atlentown Atlantic League team, accepted thirteen chances (two putouts and cleven assists) in a fourteen-inning 4-to-4 game played with Lancaster. Edward Barrow, now president of the Eastern League, then was the president of the Atlantic League.

1909 Porty-four assists were chalked up in the Cincinnati-New York game, which was of regulation length. The Giants had twenty-five assists and the Reds nineteen.
