Again, we are told of a single gallon of this drink causing a fight in which fifty were killed. 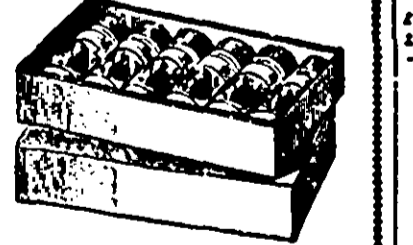
