FIRST DAY.

The Fourth General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada began its sittings in the Central Presbyterian Church, Hamilton. There was a large attendance of Ministers and elders, and a considerable number of the general

Rev. Dr. Topp, of Toionto, Moderator of the Assembly of 1876, presided, in the unavoidable absence of fast year's Moterator, Rev. Dr. McLeod, of Sydney, N.S., who, as has already been stated, is lying sick at his home.

After the singing of a portion of a psalm, prayer was engaged in by Rev. Dr. Topp, who afterwards read the first chapter of Colossians. A portion of the 102nd Psalm was then suing.

1)r. Topp delivered the opening sermon, preaching from the following words, contained in the first chapter of l'aul's Epistle to the Colossians, last clause of the 27th, and the 28th and 29th verses:

"Christ in you, the hope of glory: whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom: that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus: Whereunto I also labor, striving according to His working, which worketh in me mightily."

At the close of the preliminary services, the Assembly was constituted with prayer by Rev. Dr. Topp.

ELECTION OF MODERATOR.

Dr. Topp, having explained that the sickness of Dr. McLeod was the cause of his occupying the position he did,
The Assembly proceeded to the election of Moderator.

Principal Grant, of Queen's College, Kingston, by the Presbyteries of Lindsay and Manitoba. Rev. Dr. Cochrane, of Brantford, by the Presbyteries of Paris and Stratford. Rev. Dr. Proudfoot, of London, by the Presbytery of London.

A letter was read from Rev. Mr. Duncan, resigning his nomination in favor of Lr. Jenkins.

Rev. Dr. Cochrane desired to have his name withdrawn. The mover and seconder of Mr. McCrae withdrew that gentleman's name, leaving the names of Drs. Jenkins and Cochrane before the meeting.

On a division, the Rev. Dr. Jenkins, of St. Paul's Church, Montreal, was elected Mederator.

Rev. John Scott suggested that the nomination be made unanimous, which was acted upon, amid loud applause.

The Moderator elect was then requested to take the chair. He thanked the brethren for the honor they had conferred upon him, an honor which any minister in that assemblage might covet. He accepted the position from them and from the Head of the Church, and he asked their prayers and sympathy. He asked them for cordial assistance in the difficult duty which he had before him during the next eight or ten days, and trusted they would remember that the assemblage had come together to work for Christ and for the benefit of His Church.
