MINUTES OF PICTOU PRESBY-TERY.

VALE COLLIERY, 14th March, 1877.

The Presbytery met here, according to appointment, this day, and was constituted with prayer by the Moderator, Rev. Geo. Coull, with whom were present Rev. Messrs. Dunn and MacKichan, and Messrs. McPherson, McLennan's Mt., and Campbell, N. Glasgow, Elders. Mr. MacKichan was chosen Clerk protem.

The Moderator stated that in accordance with minute of the quarterly meeting of Presbytery held at Pictou on the 28th ult, the Presbytery has now met to consider the petition of certain residents of Sutherland's River, Vale Colliery, and vicinity, praying to be formed into a separate congregation in connection with the Church of Scotland. The representatives of the proposed new congregation being present stated that the reasons for taking this step were given at the previous meeting of Presbytery, and that the people were very enthusiastic in the matter.

The New Glasgow session, through their representative, declared their willinguess to have all the families at Sutherland's River, Vale Colliery, and vicinity, at present in connection with their congregations, detached from them and formed into a separate congrega-Mr. Fraser, Elder, and Mesers. McDonald and McMcKenzie, trustees of McLennan's Mt. congregation, said that though regretting this movement, still they did not consider it their duty to throw any obstacle in the way. It was then moved by Mr. MacKichan, seconded by Mr. Campbell, that the prayer of the petition be granted. This motion was declared carried, Rev. Mr. Dunn dissenting.

In accordance with the foregoing resolution the Presbytery did and hereby

do declare the petitioners a distinct on gregation in connection with the Churc of Scotland, and under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery of Pictou; and dalso declare the following to be elder of said new congregation and member of Kirk Session, viz. Messic. Ale Cameron, Angus McBean, Don. Grand John Munro. Rev. G. Coull appointed interim Moderator, and he instructed to call a congregational maing on some suitable day next week the election of trustees.

After transacting some other busines the sederunt was closed with the best diction.
