

their cars and complying with the testing requirement in appropriate cases; in compliance with the legal requirement that fully adequate third party (minimum \$500,000) insurance should at all times be held in respect of motor vehicles in their possession or use; and in observing the speed limits.

(d) Fishing and Hunting Licences

Complimentary fishing and hunting licences may be issued by the provincial authorities to diplomatic officers and career consular officers and members of their families. Foreign representatives residing in Ontario may address their requests to the Protocol Division of External Affairs. Consular officers accredited in Quebec may direct their requests either to the Department of External Affairs or to the Protocol Service of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs in Quebec City, G1R 4Z7.

Applications for Ontario hunting licences must be accompanied by a photocopy of an hunting licence issued by any jurisdiction (expired licences or accepted) or a hunting licence examination certificate. The examination certificates are obtainable through completion of a test administered for a \$3.00 fee by district offices of the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources. Application forms for the test are obtainable from Protocol Division.

(e) Liquor and Alcohol

1. Purchase

Duty-Free Spirits, Wines, and Beers

(i) Ontario (Ottawa). Diplomatic officers and career consular officers may purchase duty-free imported spirits, wines and beers from the following:

Details of availability and price of imported brands may be obtained from the above office.

A note should be prepared in triplicate indicating the brands and quantities required; the names, positions and Ontario Sales Exemption Card Numbers of the requesters. The Note must be signed by the Ambassador or High Commissioner, and the seal of the mission affixed. The Notes shall then be taken to the Customs and Excise Officer at 360 Coventry Road, Ottawa, for approval before presentation to the Liquor Control Board. A cheque made payable to the Liquor Control Board of Ontario, or cash should accompany the Note. Canadian products should be purchased from the Distillery or Winery concerned.
