Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

The current U.S. tariff on beer made from malt is 1.6¢/litre. All other ale, beer, porter and stout are duty free. Under the Free Trade Agreement, all items in this sector become duty free by January 1, 1998 with ten equal stages of tariff reductions.
