- (c) Any offer of an ex-gratia payment or payment itself by the Thai authorities may be sent to the claimant directly or through the Deputy Minister of the Department of National Defence.
- (d) Nothing in this article affects the jurisdiction of courts in Canada to entertain an action against a trainee unless and until there has been payment in full satisfaction of the claim.
 - (e) Where the claim has been adjudicated by a court in Canada or Thailand and a judgment rendered in favour of the claimant, the Thai authorities will consider whether to make an ex-gratia payment to satisfy the judgment, or to take such other steps as they may within the bounds of Thai domestic legislation to seek compliance with the judgement.

ARTICLE 14

Immigration

On the conditions in the second paragraph of this article and subject to compliance with the formalities established by Canada relating to entry into, and departure from, Canada, of military trainees from foreign countries, trainees shall be exempt from passport and visa regulations on entering or leaving Canada.
