The Department of the Secretary of State today released further details concerning the visit to Ottawa on November 12th of Her Majesty Queen Eligabeth, the Queen Mother.

Firm times for all the functions have not yet been established but the C-5 aircraft carrying the royal party is scheduled to take off from Newport News, Virginia at 2.45 p.m. Friday, November 12th. Her Majesty will arrive at the R.C.A.F. Station, Uplands, Ottawa, at approximately 6.00 p.m. that evening. The exact route of the royal party from Uplands to Government House will be provided later but it is expected that a motorcade with the Queen Mother in a special car equipped with an illuminated plastidome will proceed to Government House via the Prescott Highway and the Federal Driveway. The Queen Mother will remain in Ottawa from November 12th to 17th and will be a guest of His Excellency the Governor-General at Government House.
